S. atomic energy research program began in 1939 with the appointment by President Roosevelt of the Advisory Committee on Uranium. The Committee and the project were transferred to the National Defense Research Committee in June 1940 and later assigned to the S-1 Section. The S-1 Section was transferred to the Office of Scientific Research and Development in November 1941. In June 1942 the programs were transferred to the War Department, Corps of Engineers. The Manhattan Engineering District (MED) of the U. S Corps of Engineers was established in August 1942 for the "Development of Substitute Materials" (DSM) and was responsible for the supervision of the research, development and testing, plant construction and production of the atomic bomb, the "Manhattan Project." In September 1942 the MED was directed by the Military Policy Committee and after April 1943 by the War Department. An atomic bomb produced under the Manhattan Project was dropped on Hiroshima, Japan, August 6, 1945. The MED organized a Manhattan Project Atomic Bomb Investigating Group August 15, and made preliminary studies, among others, of the bomb's damage to physical structures in Hiroshima and Nagasaki during September 1945. Photographs in the "Report by Major Noland Varley, Manhattan District Corps of Engineers on the Physical Damage, Hiroshima, Japan" (Vols. I – III) were taken by members of the MED group including Dr. W. C. Penney. Vol. I consists of a summary of the physical effects of the bomb on structures, meteorology, the population, and public utilities. Graphs and an annotated map are attached. Vols. To accomplish its goal, the Agency conducts field and simulated tests to assess and to enhance the ability of human and animal life, electronic equipment and machinery, and buildings and other structures to withstand the immediate and longterm effects of nuclear weapons stockpile and its associated report system, conducts nuclear surety inspections, and is prepared to provide emergency response support in the event of a nuclear weapons accident or incident. In addition, it provides advice and assistance to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Military Departments on all nuclear matters, including site security, tactics, vulnerability, and radiation effects. The photographs in this series are copies of originals still retained by the DNA, DOD Nuclear Information Analysis Center (DASIAC). While most of the original photographs were taken by photographers hired by the Defense Nuclear Agency, some were acquired from originals already deposited in the Still Pictures Branch of the National Archives. Finally, researchers should note that a large number of photographs relating to the nuclear testing program are still classified and Nevada test sites primarily from 1946 to 1958, the year in which the Soviet Union and the United States agreed to a moratorium on the testing of atomic and hydrogen warheads. Second, they illustrate test activities, that is, the preparations—the machinery and equipment used, personnel assembled, buildings constructed, and precautionary measures taken—for each test. The photographs also illustrate the impact which nuclear blasts had both on the landscape of the test site and on the buildings, bridges, and railroads specifically designed and built for the tests. Of particular interest are photographs showing the fleet assembled for Operation Crossroads, the first post–World War II test, and the structural damage to the ships following detonation. It was named DOORSTEP to dramatize to the American public what might be expected to happen if an atomic blast took place on the doorsteps of an American city. The FCDA conducted some limited tests in three areas: 1) the effect of a blast on two typical American styles of homes; 2) is test of the strength of 8 typical outdoor home type bomb shelters; and 3) a test of the exposure of typical vehicles to determine the amount of protection provided, and the mechanical operation of the vehicles after the blasts. For additional detail, see the FCDA produced publication at the end of the photographs for this test. For information on Operation CUE, see the description for 304–OC. Operation REDWING, was the first airborne test of an H-bomb, and was conducted at Bikini Atoll, Pacific Islands Testing Ground, on May 21, 1956. Operation PLUMBOB consisted of 24 (each assigned different codenames such as "Kepler", "GHN", "GALILEO", etc.) separate tests of atomic weapons conducted during the summer of 1957 at the Yucca Flats, Nevada testing ground.
