# How to deal with side effects after COVID-19 vaccination

(For the Pfizer and Takeda/Moderna vaccines)





## Symptoms of Possible Side Effects


- ○The vaccines are highly effective against getting COVID-19. The process of building immunity may cause symptoms, such as:
  - ◆ Pain at the injected site
  - **♦** Fever
  - **♦** Tiredness
  - **♦** Headache
  - ◆ Muscle or joint pain
  - **♦** Chills
  - **♦** Diarrhea



- OAccording to the survey results conducted in Japan,
  - Most of these symptoms became intense the day after vaccination and subside within a few days.
  - The most common symptom was <u>pain at the injected site</u>.


    More than 80% of the vaccinated individuals experienced this symptom on the next day.
  - Fever, tiredness, and headache were more intense in the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose than in the 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - In some cases, the Takeda/Moderna vaccine caused delayed skin reactions at the injected site, such as itchiness, swelling and redness.

## How to deal with the symptoms

#### [Fever, Pain]


- ◆ Fever medicine and painkillers can be effective.


  (In the cohort study, various medicines such as Acetaminophen, Loxoprofen, Ibuprofen were used. These are available in pharmacies.)
- ◆ Drink plenty of fluids, such as water, when you have a fever.
- ◆ Consult your doctor or pharmacist if you are pregnant, nursing, or with any preexisting conditions.

#### [Redness, Itchiness]

◆ Cooling and applying antihistamines or steroids can help relieve the itching. Insect bite medicines also contain the above medications.

### **After Vaccination**

Vaccines have been shown to be highly effective, but not 100% effective.

Even after vaccination, please continue to take measures to prevent infection, such as <u>wearing a mask</u>.
