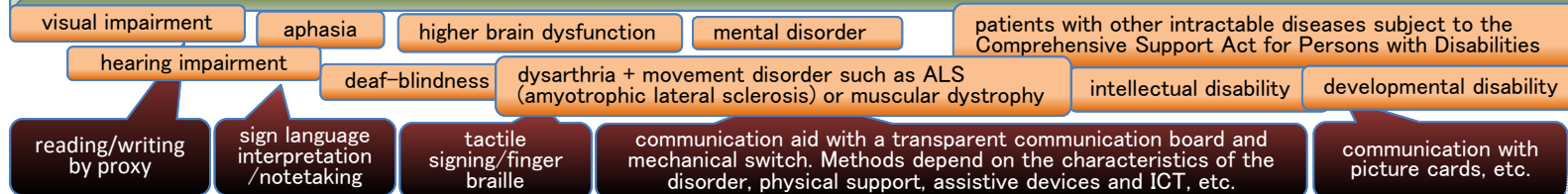


Research on Effective Methods for Promoting Measures for Enhancing Information Accessibility in Policies of Health and Welfare for Disabled People

In addition, a summary of support methods required for each disorder, which is useful for creating guidelines for supporting communication, will be created with materials that show their validity and effects.

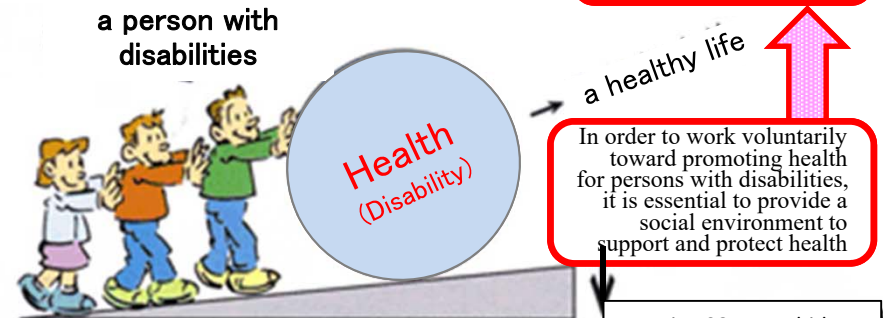


Investigative Research for Constructing an Information System for Prognosis Utilizing a Trauma Medical Database

With an aging population and enhanced health-care standards, tertiary prevention of trauma, such as efficient and effective provision of consecutive medical and welfare care for acquired disorders, needs to be improved, along with primary prevention of trauma, such as prevention of fractures and falls. In addition, a model information system will be evaluated and investigated for constructing the information system for prognosis for injury that is necessary to support the independent health promotion activities of persons with disabilities and to perform evidence-based assessments of interventions and measures.
